At graduation, Herbert Armstrong personally asked that Mr. Dean become part of his traveling team. After many years serving under Mr. Armstrong, Mr. Dean continues to serve as ABC Dean of Students, International Advisor and COE member.

Originally from South Africa, Stephen de Campos has called Dallas, Texas, home for the past 17 years. 


