Romans 12:2

Transformation vs. Conformity

Conformity is a type of social influence involving a change in belief or behavior in order to fit in with a group. This change is in response to real or imagined group pressure.

Transform: To change in composition or structure; to change the outward form or appearance of; to change in character or condition; to cause (a cell) to undergo genetic transformation

to conform one's self (i.e. one's mind and character) to another's pattern

Being Transformed Defined

μεταμορφόω

Metamorphoō

Used 4x in New Testament

to change into another form, to transform, to transfigure

the root to our modern word met·a·mor·pho·sis

meta·mor·pho·sis

1a: change of physical form, structure, or substance especially by <u>supernatural</u> means the *metamorphosis* of humans into animals
b: a striking alteration in appearance, character, or circumstances. "The company has gone through a series of *metamorphoses*."

2: a typically marked and more or less abrupt developmental change in the form or structure of an animal (such as a butterfly or a frog) occurring subsequent to birth or hatching




Matthew 17:1-2, 5

Defining "Mind" vs. Brain

Brain and mind are not the same. Your brain is part of the visible, tangible world of the body. Your mind is part of the invisible, transcendent world of thought, feeling, attitude, belief and imagination. The brain is the physical organ most associated with mind and consciousness, but the mind is not confined to the brain. The intelligence of your mind permeates every cell of your body, not just brain cells. Your mind has tremendous power over all bodily systems.



"Mind" is Distinct from Brain

1. Corinthians 2:11

For what man knows the things of a man, except the spirit ^{G4151} of man which is in him? Even so the things of God knows no man, but the Spirit ^{G4151} of God.

G4151, Greek pneuma, is nowhere translated mind in the New Testament

Mark 12:30

'And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment.

διάνοια diánoia, dee-an'-oy-ah; from <u>G1223</u> and <u>G3563</u> Greek *Nous* Romans 12:2; deep thought, properly, the faculty (mind or its disposition), by implication, its exercise:—imagination, mind, understanding.

- 1. The mind, comprising alike the faculties of perceiving and understanding and those of feeling, judging, determining
 - A. The intellectual faculty, the understanding
 - B. Reason in the narrower sense, as the capacity for spiritual truth, the higher powers of the soul, the faculty of perceiving divine things, of recognizing goodness and of hating evil
 - C. The power of considering and judging soberly, calmly and impartially
- 2. A particular mode of thinking and judging, i.e thoughts, feelings, purposes, desires
