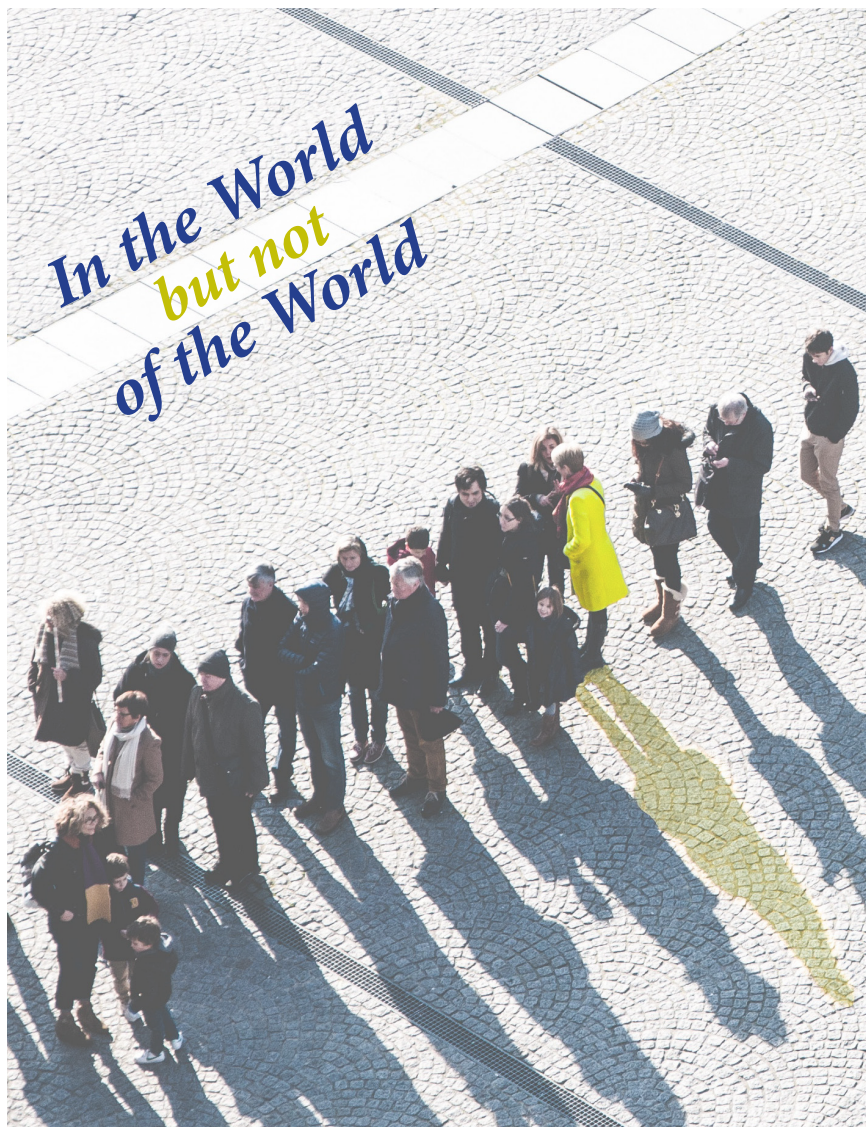

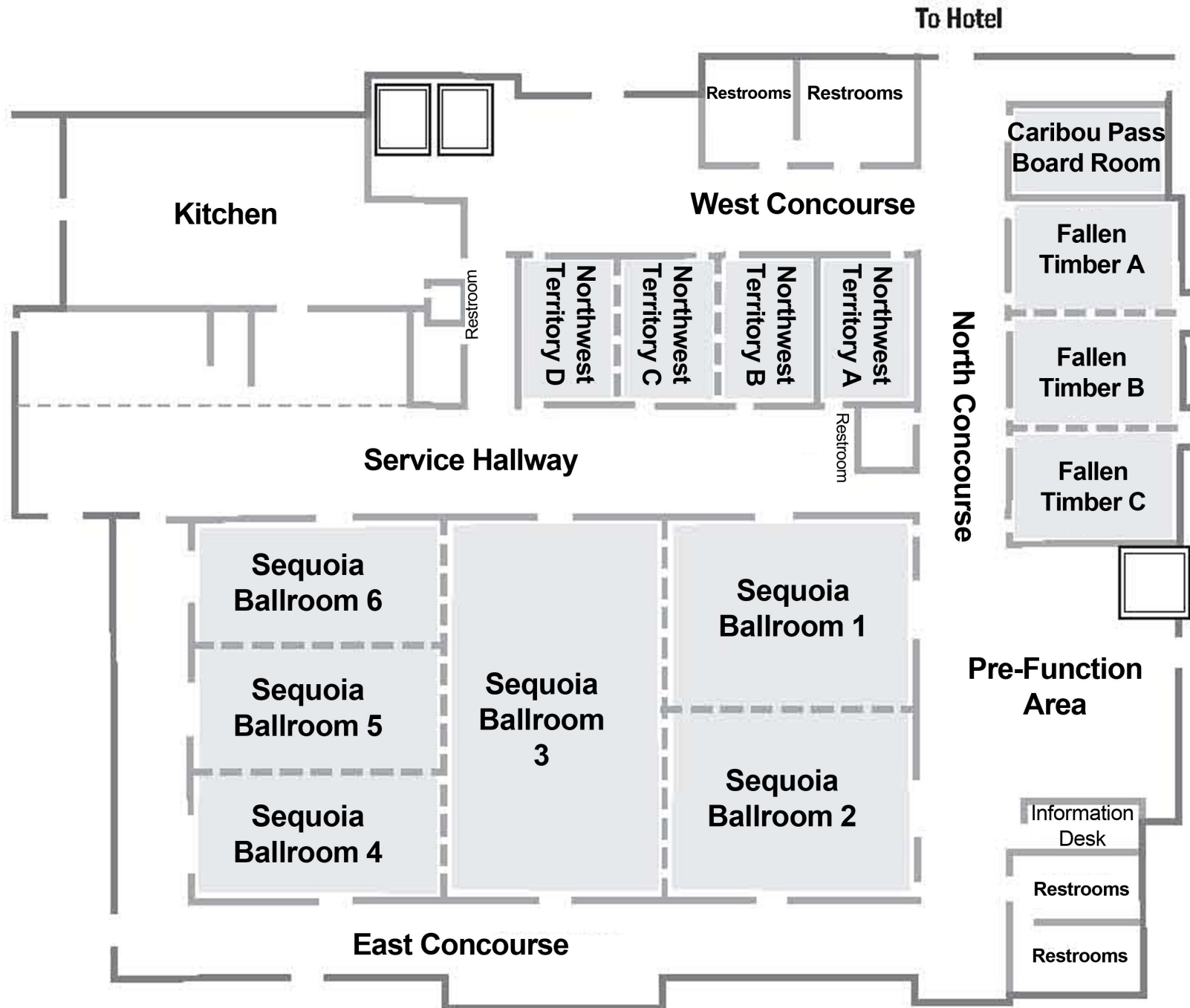
Cincinnati Young Adult Weekend
