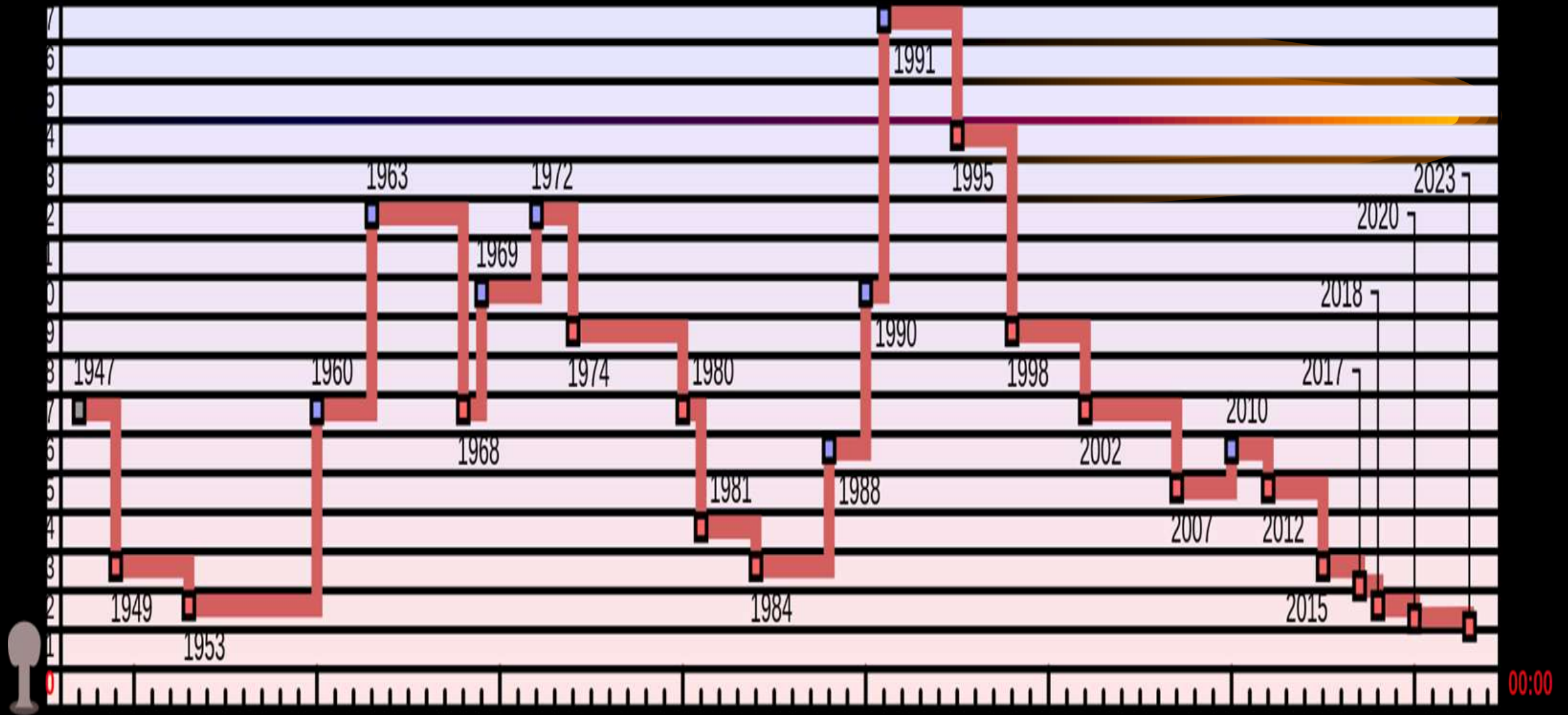

GIANTS OF THE BATTLEFIELD: THE TANKS HEADING TO UKRAINE



Abrams M1A2 (USA)

- Cost per tank: £7.2m (estimate)
- Main armament: M256 120mm smooth bore cannon
- Engine: 1500 HP gas turbine engine

- Speed: 42 mph
- Weight: 73.6 tonnes
- Crew: 4
- Length: 9.77m
- Width: 3.7 m
- Height: 2.4 m
- Range: 264 miles

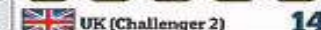

■ America was initially reluctant to offer the Abrams because it was considered less suitable for Ukraine than the Leopard 2. It uses jet fuel which is harder to source than diesel and has complex maintenance requirements. Delivery could take months.

Norway, Finland, the Netherlands and Spain are all prepared to send Leopard 2s. France is still considering whether to offer its Leclerc tank.



LEOPARD 2 (Germany)



Biggest benefits to the Ukrainians of Leopards are the huge stocks of ammo and spare parts across 12 Nato partners, making it easy to service and maintain on the battlefield.

- Cost per tank: £5m
- Main armament: 120mm Rheinmetall L55 smooth bore gun
- Engine: V12 twin-turbo diesel
- Speed: 45 mph
- Weight: 55-62 tonnes depending on armour choices
- Crew: 4
- Length: 7.7m
- Width: 3.7m
- Height: 3m
- Range: 342 miles

CHALLENGER 2 (UK)



Overall, the C2 is heavier and slower than the Leopard but is better protected.

- Cost per tank: £5m
- Main armament: L30A1 with 49 rounds
- Engine: Perkins V12 diesel
- Speed: 40mph
- Weight: 62.5 tonnes - but up to 80 tonnes depending on choices of armour protection
- Crew: 4
- Length: 8.2m
- Width: 3.3m
- Height: 2.4m
- Range: 340 miles on road

LECLERC (France)



Comparable to other Western main battle tanks but viewed as harder to maintain, and less well armoured than the Challenger. Uses an automatic loader and so has a crew of only three.

- Cost per tank: £14m
- In service: 1990-present
- Main armament: 120mm smoothbore
- Armour: modular composite
- Engine: 8-cylinder diesel
- Speed: 44mph
- Crew: 3
- Length: 6.9m
- Width: 3.7m
- Height: 2.5m
- Range: 342 miles

AND HERE'S WHAT THEY'RE UP AGAINST...



The most widely used battle tank in the world, but, despite upgrades, now considered outdated and crude. Ukraine war has demonstrated its vulnerability to anti-tank weapons.

- Cost: (Based on sale to Ethiopia in 2011) £500,000.
- In service: 1973-present
- Main armament: 125mm smooth bore cannon
- Armour: steel and composite (penetrable by Germany's DM63 anti-tank ammunition)
- Engine: T72: V12 diesel
- Speed: 47mph
- Crew: 3
- Length: 9.5m
- Width: 3.6m
- Height: 2.2m
- Range: 431 miles





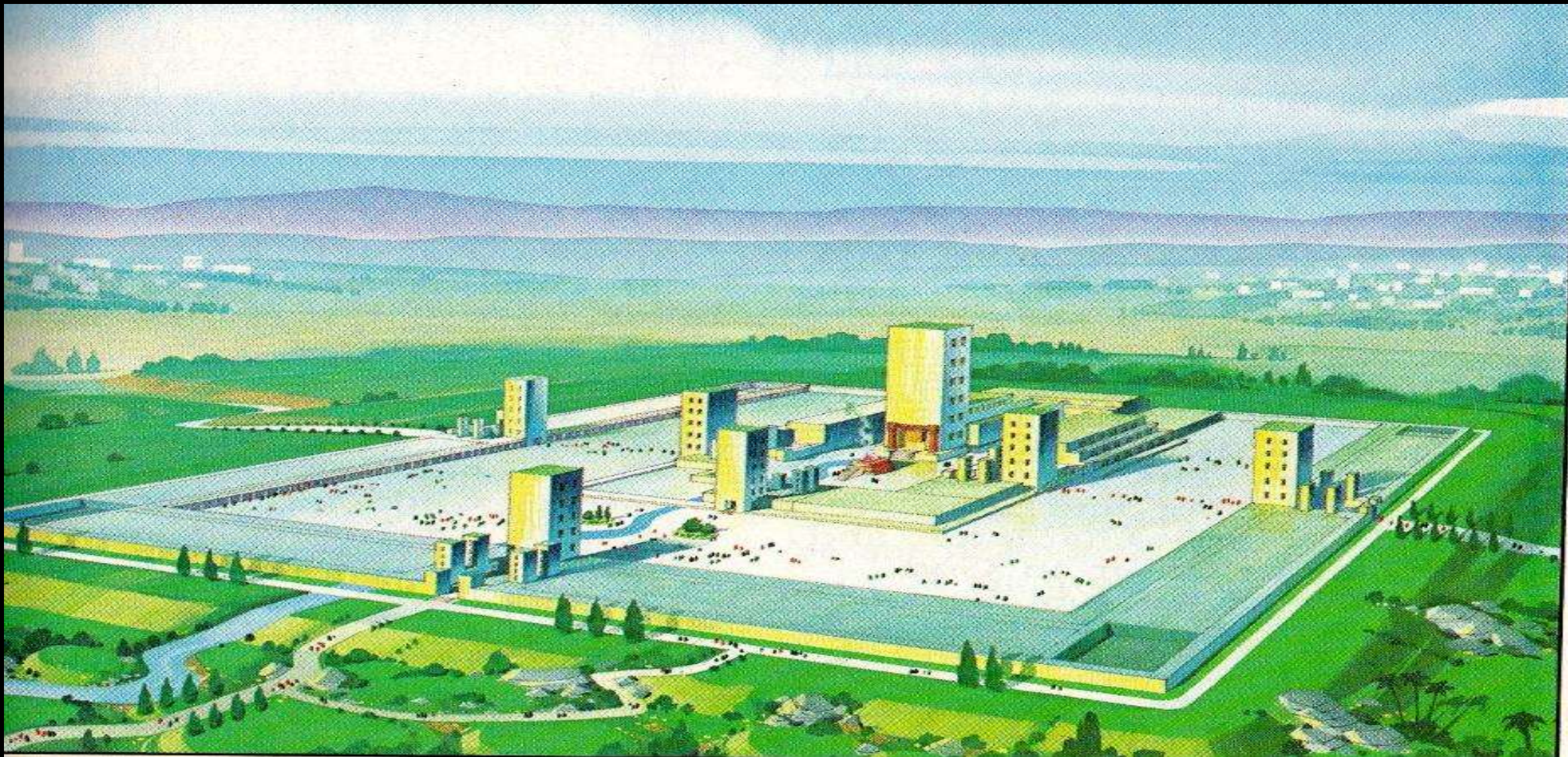
The Doomsday Clock will not end with the destruction of the entire world, but Christ will intervene to save the earth (Mt. 24:29-31).



Man will not go after death to a boring heaven – God has something infinitely better in mind as the Bible tells us.

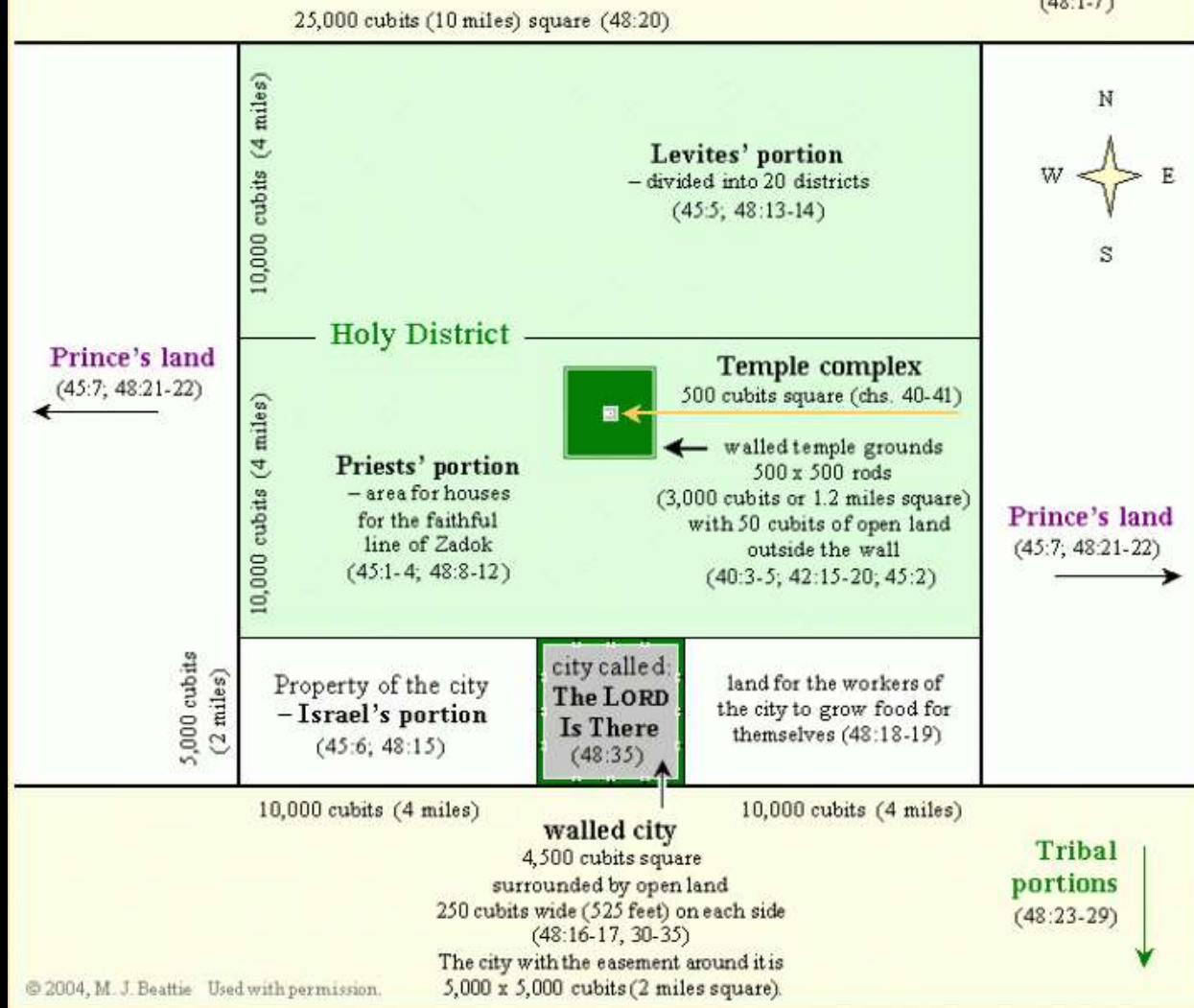

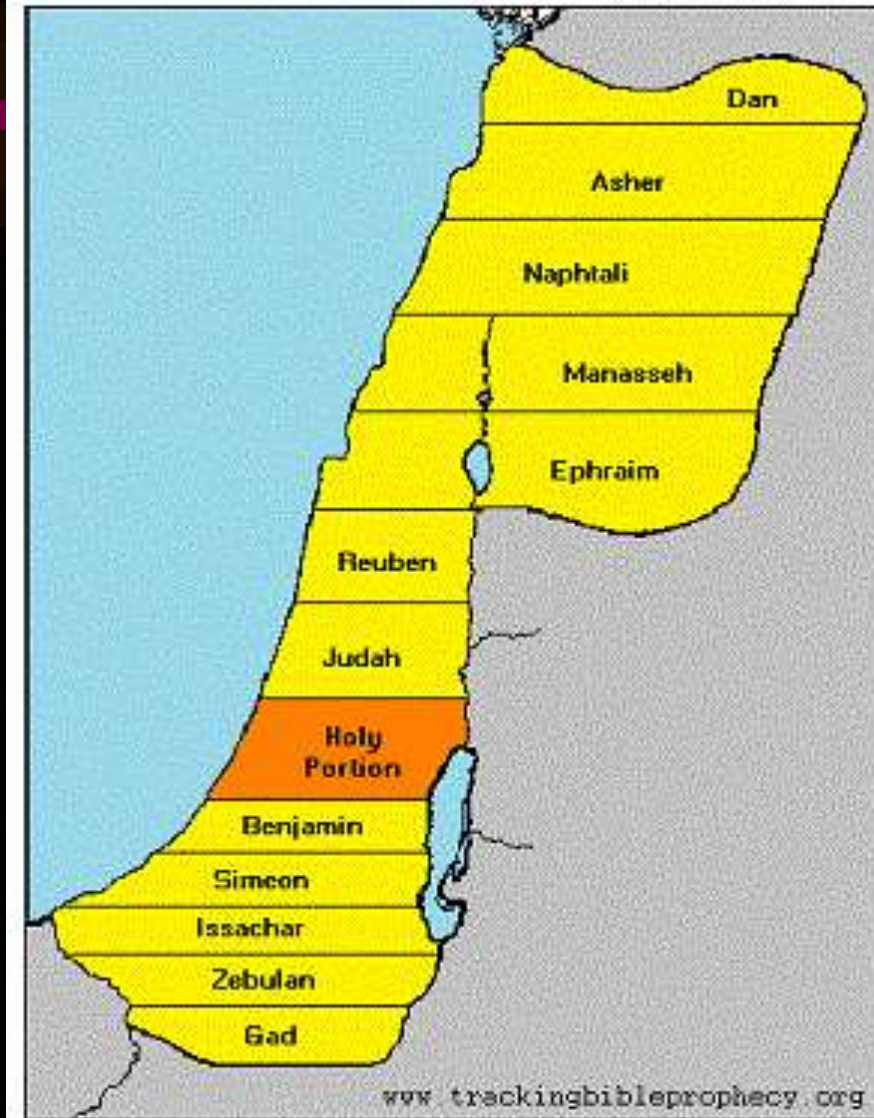


*Artistic depiction of the new Jerusalem during the Millennium

Layout of the Holy District and City Foretold through Ezekiel



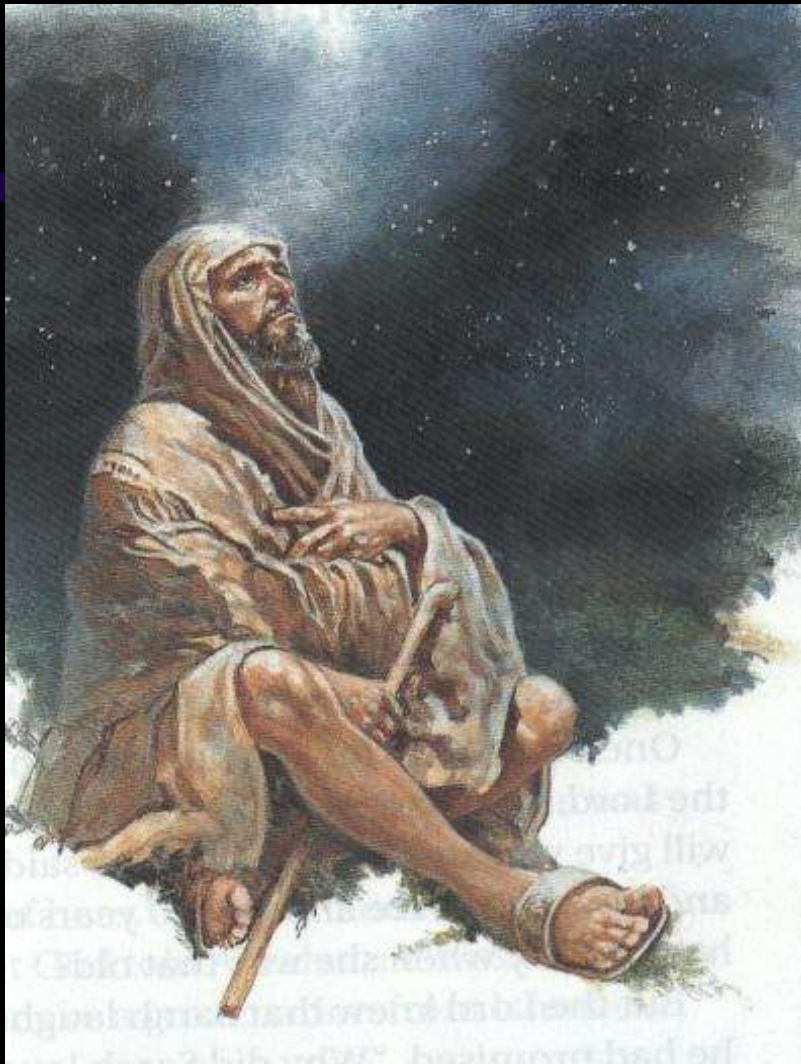
Millennial Land Allotment - Ezekiel 47:15-21
