Meetings in Colombia on the Sabbath & on Sunday







On Wednesday, we visited the Youth Camp in Lima




They plan to have their first camp this coming week.

Our next trip — from Lima, Peru to La Paz, Bolivia, which took an hour and a half.




The international airport in La Paz is 13,325 feet above sea level – no international airport in the world is higher

La Paz is a city of a million people



It is situated in a basin, like a giant volcanic crater. In the early days, gold was found towards the bottom of the basin and thus, people settled there.

Since 2014, an Austrian company built numerous skyways over the city, which act like subway stations. We took five of the lines on Sunday to see all of La Paz from the air.





On the Sabbath, we met with the Bolivian brethren. They are quite well educated — including an architect, a teacher and a university student. We also visited a dear couple who are shut-ins.





We returned to Lima and then headed home, but there is another lesson to be learned in Peru – how one of the "footprints" of Genesis was apparently left in the sands of time in Nazca, Peru. Three hundred miles south of Lima are the famous Nazca lines, which I visited back in the 1990's. I took a plane around the Nazca valley and saw all the figures drawn in the ground. Now, there are over 700 discovered. I went to the museum there and heard a talk by the archaeologist Maria Reiche. She had an assistant, Jadwiga Pasenkiewicz that I think I met.







The flight over the Nazca plain. I later read that Jadwiga's 12 years of research had her conclude that the Nazca lines were geoglyphs that narrated the history of the Nazca people, just like in a school textbook, but drawn on the ground. For millenia, Nazca is one of the driest places on earth and the lines have survived. She said these drawings followed the narratives of the first chapters of the book of Genesis. What follows is the best that can be determined at this time about this topic.








Here are some of the famous pictures of the Nazca lines that are huge (show rock I got from there). The hummingbird in the middle is 320 ft long. The figures are dug from the dark surface of the soil that yields to a whiter color beneath.

The Nazca Lines cover miles of the valley of Nazca. It is calculated that they are over 2,000 years old. You can imagine a Nazca teacher taking children to the top of the mountain and going over the figures as a memory device to teach them about their history.






Book: The Rulers of the Lost Worlds

In this book and a magazine called Muy Interesante, I read the account of how Jadwiga apparently deciphered what these lines meant. As the interviewers wrote, "The most famous, according to our interviewee, is the Nazca text. With this message, our forgotten predecessors come to inform us about their scientific discoveries and their dogmas of faith.

"Thus concludes Jadwiga Pasenkiewicz, and gives us the Nazca text, which is none other <u>than the story of Genesis</u>, conceived by "divine inspiration" in antediluvian times and faithfully transmitted through infinite generations. [She goes on to say]

"God created the Universe within a circle expanding toward infinity. After forging the birth of the stellar worlds, the Almighty concerned himself with creating life. First, He formed the plant cell that gave rise to plants. Then, an organic being, the symbolic outline of a fish, from which...animals and man would emerge...They had their own Bible, and developed in three different eras: first, that of the pre-Flood kingdoms and empires, when the 'Bible' was written. The second begins with the great cataclysm [Flood]...which destroyed civilizations and gave rise to a very long period of insecurity and terrible suffering for the few survivors [i.e. Noah & family]." What continues is her interpretation which follows the Bible pretty closely, but it might not be the last word on it. We will have to wait and see but it points to a common origin of mankind.


These are the symbols she interpreted using the Nazca lines and their ceramic art figures as a guide










2. "God next created 'plants' and 'marine life' - fish."






Jadwiga correctly interprets the tree as the tree of life and others have interpreted another figure as the tree of knowledge. She doesn't know what a walking serpent means, but we do. Man sinned and hands were raised in anguish.




She misinterprets this multi-headed flying creature as a flying human, but it is more likely the winged Cherubim placed to protect the Garden of Eden and scare off possible intruders.

This is no "monkey" figure, for it is climbing stairs into a boatlike ark.




Man entering ark



Animals brought aboard

Next, she recognizes mankind degenerates and God punishes him with a worldwide Flood. She correctly interprets the so called "monkey" not as a monkey, but as a man entering an ark and animals carried aboard. Yet she mistakes it as an ark bringing life to the earth (which is not part of Genesis) but actually it's a later narration of the Flood and Noah's ark, with all kinds of animals included.



She believes that the spider is the "signature" of the Nazca creators and after the flood. Then kingdoms are set up, like that of Nimrod. After that comes the Tower of Babel and the confusion of the tongues, where the origins of history in different languages where taken to the ends of the earth. I find it fascinating that in this part of the world, people like the Mayans, with their sacred book, The Popol Vu, and the Nazca people apparently would record their origins which fit the biblical record. This is a lesson to remember that the Bible is a book about true history and not about myths!
