Solomon's Temple Dedication (1 Kgs 8; 2 Chr 5-7)	Solomon rehearses covenant	Petition for forgiveness	Sacrifices; Feast of Tabernacles	Temple inaugurated; glory fills	Institution-centered, not a new heart for all	Solomon's idolatry; nation divided into two kingdoms
Return from Exile — Altar Rebuilt (Ezra 3)	As written in the Law	Return from exile implies repentance	Burnt offerings; Tabernacles	Worship before foundation	Only altar rebuilt; incomplete work	Opposition halted temple work (Ezra 4:1-5, 24)
Nehemiah's Revival (Neh 8-9)	Law read publicly	Weeping; confession of sins	Kept Feast of Tabernacles with joy	Covenant oath renewal	Oath-based, not new covenant heart	Relapsed: neglect of tithes, Sabbath, marriages (Neh 13)

Jehoshaphat's Fast (2 Chr 20)	Prophetic word: battle is the Lord's	'We have no power... our eyes on You'	Levites praise the LORD	God delivers; peace	Crisis-driven, episode-bound	Later corrupt alliances (2 Chr 20:35-37)
Hezekiah's Revival (2 Chr 29-31)	Priests taught; temple opened	Admitted fathers' guilt	Cleansing; Passover	Idols removed; joy	Leader-dependent reform	Manasseh reversed everything (2 Kgs 21:2-9)
Josiah's Revival (2 Kgs 22-23; 2 Chr 34-35)	Book of the Law read	Josiah humbled himself	Passover; covenant renewal	Idols destroyed; nation recommitted	Hinged on one king's leadership	Judgment decreed; reforms died with him
Nineveh (Jon 3)	Jonah's proclamation	Fasting, sackcloth, renouncing evil	Called on God earnestly	Ceased violence	Royal decree, not lasting covenant	Later returned to wickedness (Nah 3:1-7)
Elijah at Carmel (1 Kgs 18)	'How long will you waver?'	Baal exposed	'The LORD, He is God!'	False prophets executed	Miracle moment, not systemic reform	Jezebel's threats; relapse (1 Kgs 19:2-4)
Pentecost (Acts 2)	Peter preached Joel & Psalms	'What shall we do?'	Baptisms; prayers; fellowship	3,000 added; church birthed	Firstfruits, not consummation	Sin, division, false teaching (Acts 5; Gal 1; Rev 2-3)
Samaria (Acts 8)	Philip preached Christ	Repented of sorcery	Baptisms; joy	Received Spirit	Local, partial advance	Mixed motives; opposition arose (Acts 8:18-23)
Ephesus (Acts 19)	Paul preached 2 years	Confessed sorcery; burned books	Jesus' name exalted	Region impacted	Regional, time-bound	Later lost first love (Rev 2:4-5)
