Trump: Gaza peace plan phase two coming ‘pretty soon’

December 4, 2025 israelnationalnews.com reported: “US President Donald Trump on Wednesday expressed confidence that the next phase of his plan for the Gaza Strip will be implemented ‘pretty soon’, despite the incident in Rafah in which five IDF soldiers were injured, one of them seriously.



Asked by a reporter when he expects phase two of the Gaza peace plan to be implemented, Trump replied, ‘Well, it’s going along well. You know, they had a problem today, I understand, with a bomb that went off. Hurt some people pretty badly...but it’s going on very well. We have peace in the Middle East. People don’t realize it. We have tremendous support.’

The IDF said earlier on Wednesday that it had responded to Hamas’ ‘blatant violation’ of the ceasefire agreement by striking a Hamas terrorist in the southern Gaza Strip...”

‘Invade Iran or accept talks,’ ex-Israel Air Force chief warns

December 4, 2025 jpost.com reported: “Former Israel Air Force commander Maj.-Gen. (res.) Eitan Ben Eliyahu said that Israel must either approve a full-scale war with Iran, including a ground invasion, or renew economic pressure and negotiations. He spoke on 103FM on Thursday, saying the June campaign, known as Operation Rising Lion, delayed Iran’s nuclear program for years but did not eliminate it.

‘Maybe the weakness in our strike is that we did not eliminate the nuclear program, but we did delay it for many years,’ Ben Eliyahu said, referring to Israel’s recent operations against Iran. He cautioned that the Islamic Republic is studying the conflict closely and adapting.

‘Either you decide on total war with Iran, including a ground invasion and a long period of home-front strain and multi-front escalation, or you choose economic pressure alongside attempts to return to negotiations,’ he said. According to Ben Eliyahu, these are the two realistic paths now facing Israel...”

‘Hezbollah disarms or Israel acts’: Netanyahu, Ortagus meet as Israel-Lebanon tensions flare

December 3, 2025 jpost.com reported: “Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Tuesday met with US President Donald Trump’s envoy for Lebanon affairs, Morgan Ortagus, in Israel as border tensions with Lebanon intensify, according to Israeli officials.

Defense Minister Israel Katz and IDF Intelligence Chief Maj. Gen. Shlomi Binder joined the meeting. The talks come one year after a ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah, which Israeli officials say is eroding.

‘If there is no dramatic change by the end of the agreement period, another round of fighting in the north is almost inevitable,’ a security official told *The Jerusalem Post*...

Representatives of the countries overseeing the ceasefire’s implementation are due to meet on Wednesday in Naqoura. Ortagus is expected to attend the session, then travel to Beirut to convey a message from senior Israeli officials. The message, according to officials, is direct: ‘Either Hezbollah disarms, or Israel will be forced to act.’...”

PA Textbooks: Six-year-olds to be taught about ‘martyrs’

December 2, 2025 israelnationalnews.com reported: “A report published by IMPACT-se presents a grim picture of the Palestinian Authority’s school curriculum for 2025-2026.

According to the report, this is a direct continuation of inciting content that contradicts UNESCO standards for education for peace and tolerance. The report examined 290 textbooks and teaching booklets used in grades 1-12 in schools in the Gaza, Judea, Samaria, and eastern Jerusalem, including UNRWA educational institutions.

The findings show that the materials continue to encourage hatred, extreme nationalism, antisemitism, and political violence. The books contain explicit antisemitic descriptions. Jews are portrayed as liars, corrupt, ‘devil’s helpers’ or ‘bloodthirsty monsters’, and the texts even promote the complete dehumanization of Israelis. For example, Israeli soldiers are described as snipers shooting children ‘for no reason’, or as carrying out massacres while ‘laughing loudly.’

Descriptions of jihad and martyrs appear in dozens of places, even at elementary school ages. First-grade students are exposed to the word ‘Shahid’ when learning the Arabic letter ﷺ. Concepts such as ‘the peak of faith’ and ‘reward in paradise’ are linked to jihad, and sometimes to descriptions of 72 virgins. In addition, the science and mathematics books themselves are political: algebra equations include variables like ‘number of shahids’, and physics exercises include descriptions of a girl firing a slingshot...”

Israel announces: Iron Beam laser system to be delivered this month

December 1, 2025 israelnationalnews.com reported: “The development of Israel’s ‘Iron Beam’ laser system is complete, and is scheduled to be delivered to the IDF on December 30, 2025, a Defense Ministry spokesperson announced Monday morning. The announcement was made by Brig. Gen. (Res.) Dr. Daniel Gold, Head of the Israel Ministry of Defense (IMOD) Directorate of Defense Research & Development (DDR&D), at the International Defense Tech Summit led by the IMOD’s DDR&D, in collaboration with the Blavatnik Cyber Research Center at Tel Aviv University.

In his statement, Dr. Gold further explained: ‘The Iron Beam laser system is expected to fundamentally change the rules of engagement on the battlefield. With development complete and a comprehensive testing program that has validated the system’s capabilities, we are prepared to deliver initial operational capability to the IDF on December 30, 2025...”

Nato mulling preemptive strikes against Russia to stop Vlad waging shadow war across Europe

‘Break Your Crosses, and Enslave Your Women’: Christians the ‘Prime Target’ of Radical Islam

November 28, 2025 breitbart.com reported: “A report from France’s domestic intelligence agency has identified Christians as the ‘prime target’ for radical Islamists, who are actively trying to stoke anti-Christian sentiment in the West with ‘anti-crusader’ propaganda.

The General Directorate for Internal Security (DGSI) has found that ‘anti-crusader’ rhetoric has been at the forefront of jihadist rhetoric and attacks over the past thirty years. The report from the French intel service, seen by *Le Figaro*, said that Islamist propaganda frequently attempts to portray Islam as a victim of the West by presenting an amalgam of historical events such as the Crusades and colonialism to recent military interventions in countries like Afghanistan, Iraq, Mali, and Syria.

Such messaging is specifically targeted at ethnic minority populations within the West to stoke division, the DGSI said, pointing to al Qaeda tied terrorist Abu Musab al-Suri, who is said to have advocated for intentionally provoking backlash against Islam to incentivize Muslims in Europe to join the jihadist cause...”

China slams Japan’s plans to deploy missiles near Taiwan

November 28, 2025 spacewar.com reported: “China slammed on Monday Japan’s decision to push ahead with a planned deployment of missiles on an island near Taiwan, escalating a weeks-long diplomatic spat.

Japanese media on Sunday quoted Japan’s defence minister Shinjiro Koizumi as saying that the planned deployment of the missiles on Yonaguni island — which is close to Taiwan — was on track.

‘The deployment can reduce the possibility of an armed attack on Japan,’ Koizumi said. Beijing-Tokyo relations have soured this month, following remarks by Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi suggesting that Tokyo could intervene militarily in any attack on Taiwan.

China’s foreign ministry on Monday said Japan’s missile deployment was a ‘deliberate attempt to create regional tension and provoke military confrontation’...”
