### Obituary: Gordon Hannaway

Gordon Hannaway of the Tampa, Florida congregation died on Jan. 17, 2026, at age 80.

Born in Philadelphia in 1945 and raised in New Jersey, he attended Tusculum College in Tennessee, where he met his wife, Holly. They were married for 57 years until her death in 2024 and had three children and seven grandchildren.

Gordon earned a master's degree from East Tennessee State University and worked over 50 years as an insurance and benefits consultant. He and Holly became members of God's Church in 1969–1970, and he was ordained a deacon in the 1980s and an elder in 2006.

In Tampa, Gordon served as Assistant YOU Coordinator, managed church finances, coordinated the Feast site, and was a steadfast pillar of the congregation. His generosity, wise counsel and dedication to God's way of life touched many and will be deeply missed.

We especially encourage applicants with leadership potential and a desire to serve in God's Church.




