2026 Festival Bulletin Announcements

Seating

1. The meeting hall will open one hour before services each day. Please do not reserve seating earlier than that unless you have assigned duties such as choir or ushering.
2. Reserve seats only for yourself and your family and friends who definitely are sitting with you. Please do not reserve seats for other families.
3. Honor all "Reserved Seating" signs. These are reserved for song leaders, ushers, staff or others that used the advance registration system.

Business Office

The Feast office is located in the Rhone room. It will be open 30 minutes before and after services.

Mothers' Room

The Mother's Room is in the Tuscany room. In order to allow others to use the room, please return to your regular seating when you are finished.

Please keep talking and noise to a minimum as a courtesy to those listening to services or trying to get infants to sleep. All parents are reminded to take care of disciplining in private – not public facilities.

Anointing / Counseling

If you need anointing or counseling, an Elders will be available 30 minutes before after services at the Rhone room / Coordinator office. If there is an emergency call (928) 509-2896 and ask for Randy Love. You can also pick up anointed cloths in the Rhone room. For anybody who is contagious, please call the phone number above for anointing, and wait for recovery before attending activities again.

Holy Day Offerings

The Holy Day offerings will be taken up on the morning services of the first Holy Day service and of the 8th Day. Checks should be made payable to “United Church of God” or “UCGIA.”

Family Helping Family Program

God intends the Feast to be a time of spiritual and physical rejoicing. Although we all have the opportunity for a spiritually rewarding Festival, we would like to make it possible for everyone to enjoy Feast-time physical activities.

If you have extra second tithe, perhaps you might consider making a donation in order to help other brethren and families participate in our group activities. A box for donations will be located at the Information Booth. Also, if you need a little help so as to attend the above activities, please stop by the Feast Coordinator office so we can help make such arrangements.

After the Feast if there are additional contributions beyond the donations, the excess will be applied to the general fund for the Temecula Feast site.

This “Family Helping Family” program is being sponsored at all U.S. and Canadian Feast sites.

Emergency Assistance

There are a few instances of unexpected emergencies that affect a member’s finances while at the feast. Before asking other brethren for financial help and before anyone gives financial assistance to others, all requests or offers of assistance should be coordinated through the business office. In most cases, the church may have already provided assistance to people and additional funds given directly from other brethren may not be necessary.

Youth Education Classes

The Festival Youth Instruction classes are available for two groupings of children. Group one is for children in grades K- 2 and the second group is for grades 3 to 6. There will be two classes for each grade category during the Feast of Tabernacles. We encourage the children to show their take home crafts and discuss with their parents what they learned in class each time. The classes are divided into the following grade categories:

Children are not required to bring anything to class with them. Teachers will have supplies for each child to use during Youth Instruction.

School grades K – 2 will meet in the Valencia Room.
School grades 3 - 6 will meet in the Tuscany Room.

Teen Activity

Teens, you are cordially invited to an afternoon of fellowship and fun at the annual teen activity on Monday, September 28, 2026, from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. PST.

The teen activity will be at Arcade Monsters, located at 39809 Avenida Acacias Suite C, Murrieta, CA 92563.

Arcade Monsters is a venue with 28,000 square feet of immersive entertainment, featuring massive arcade gaming, a full roller-skating rink, mini-bowling, themed environments, and expansive open space designed for nonstop play. Pizza and drinks are included.

Sign-up sheets will be located at the Information Table, and the cost is \$10 per teen with a maximum of \$30 per family. We look forward to seeing you there!"

Teen Activity Liability Policy

“The United Church of God, *an International Association* provides adult chaperones at all officially sponsored activities for teens during the Feast of Tabernacles at all U.S. locations. Officially sponsored activities are those announced from the pulpit and/or included in the printed announcements. Our standing policy and expectation at Feast of Tabernacles teen activities is that teens (under the age of 18) are to remain at the activity until it is over and/or until their parent(s) or other authorized adult arrives to pick them up. The Church asks that parents advise activity chaperones in advance if they want their teen to be able to leave the premises prematurely during an activity. The Church is not responsible for the oversight of teens once they have left the protection of sponsored activity locations, nor for activities they may engage in that are not officially sponsored.”

Youth Booklets

All attendees who registered for the Feast may pick up their Festival Youth booklets at the information table. There is one booklet all children ages 5 - 12.

Please give your child's name to the volunteer and they will check off your child's name when they receive their book. If you did not register for the Feast, please wait until all other books have been passed out and then if there are any extra you may pick up one for your child. You may also print out the booklets from the UCG website if there are not any extra booklets available.

Etiquette for Services: Consider these guidelines, based on biblical principles of courtesy and respect.

Be on Time: While a few brethren will occasionally be late for the Church services, regularly coming late to services without a legitimate reason shows a lack of respect for both God and the membership. Please do your best to be on time each day.

Fragrance Allergies

Over the last few years our society has significantly increased with those suffering from fragrance allergies. We do not want to isolate those members into private rooms to listen to services. Unless there is a special need or emergency, we are asking members to refrain from wearing perfumes and colognes to services and indoor activities. Your cooperation will allow others to attend services.

During Church Services: With a large number of members coming together for the Feast of Tabernacles, we often need to address extra people seated in or wandering through the lobby and/or the back of the meeting hall. While there may be a reason for a few people in these areas during services, it is generally inappropriate to be fellowshipping or wandering around in the lobby or the back of the hall while services are being conducted. If you are the 1stth person to read this and under age 19, notify the Feast Coordinator for a gift, not fair to tell somebody else. Ushers and security personnel will be assigned to limit unnecessary traffic in these areas. Please cooperate by remaining in your seat during the services unless given an assignment or having a need that would require otherwise.

Children: Children are a great blessing! However, parents should focus on the need to train their children to sit or be occupied quietly during services. It does take work, effort and patience. If a child's behavior becomes disruptive, one of the parents should as quietly as possible, take the child from services, and tend to his or her needs.

Congregation's Response: On the other hand, as parents are working with their small children, we all should show patience and support for them.

Cell Phones: Cell phones should be turned off or muted during Church services. If it is necessary to answer a call during services, you should do so outside the meeting hall so as not to disturb others around you.

Computer/Video Games: Whether to allow any video games at services is a parental choice. However, many are not quiet and can be distracting. If a child is old enough to play a video game, he or she is likely old enough to learn from the service.

Clothing: What kind of clothing is appropriate for Church services? We should come before God wearing our best. Our attire should be modest and such that shows the proper respect for worshipping before God.

Applause for Special Music

“The United Church God, *an International Association* requests that you not applaud for sermonettes, sermons or special music during the Feast. One exception to this request *continues to* be the performance of the children's choir. In general, it can be shown that the Bible makes a distinction between music for worship and music for celebrating and entertaining. There is no biblical statement prohibiting applause, but since special music is a part of our service worshipping God, we request that you *refrain from applauding* and instead offer any encouragement or appreciation to the individuals on a personal level. A number of musicians and singers have stated a preference for no applause, wishing only to contribute to our worship of God. To those who feel this way, it is embarrassing to receive applause for their efforts.”

Merchandising

It is inappropriate to sell, display or distribute at our information tables or booths anything of a commercial or fund-raising nature without prior approval.

Literature Distribution

Only those materials approved by the Festival Coordinator may be distributed at the Feast sites. No other religious material, or any political materials, can be displayed or distributed at any Festival site of the United Church of God, an International Association.

Housing Survey and General Survey (Online Only)

This year both the Housing survey and the General survey will be Online Only.

We strongly urge everyone to fill out the two surveys as they greatly assist in future negotiations and provides legitimate feedback to the hotels and the general survey will greatly assist in future planning.

On the 4th day of the Feast, Tuesday, September 29, the online QR will be activated and ready for use.

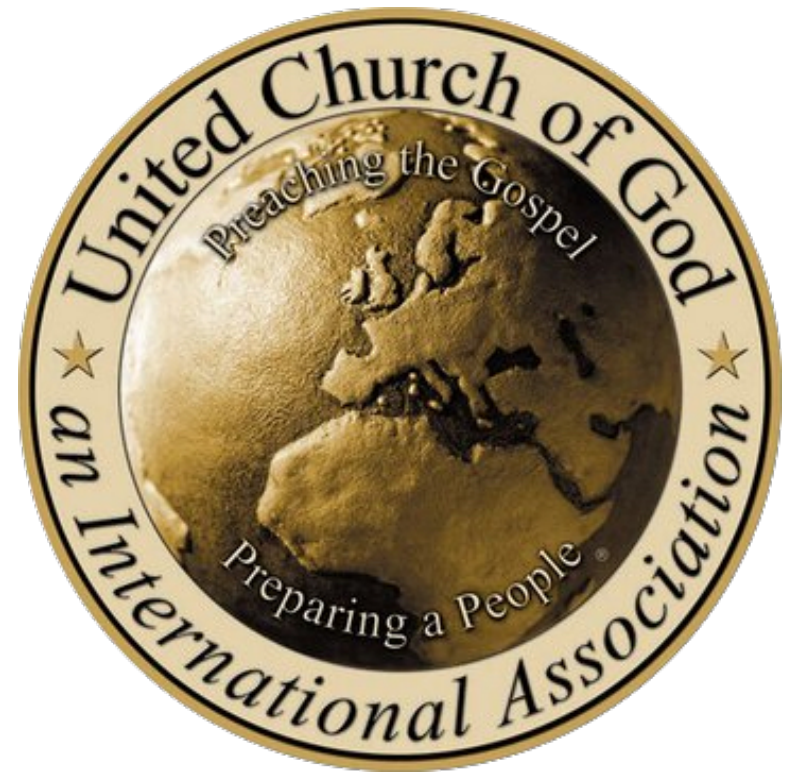
