





Mothers' Room—During services and seminars, there will be a private area on the second floor for nursing mothers.


Overflow and Fragrance Free Room—The Riverside room (directly across from the ballroom on the second floor) will provide additional seating during services.

Sabbath Seminars—Seminars will be held in the Hamilton Room. See page 10 for details and schedule.




