Feast of Unleavened Bread

There Festivals of God, listed in Leviticus 23, tied the agricultural system of Ancient Israel to their health and prosperity. Following them as prescribed by God was essential for their physical existence or else they would face invasion, starvation, or even death. Today we see the Festivals of God from a spiritual perspective that shines a light on prophecy as God's plan of Salvation and eternal life for those who walk according to the plan as outlined in the festivals.

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1.	The Passover and Feast of Unleavened Bread come at the beginning of the spring harvest festival season. This is contrasted with the fall harvest festival season. Who is the spring harvest focused on? What scriptures can you find that tell us this?
2.	If Passover Represents Christ as the first of the firstfruits, and Pentecost the harvest of the rest of the first fruits, what does Unleavened Bread in this harvest analogy picture?
3.	How do we know that the first century church kept the Feast of Unleavened Bread? What NT scriptures talk about sin in reference to bread and leaven?
4.	John 6:4-13 is the story of the Loaves and Fishes that happened right before the feast of Unleavened bread. The Disciples commented that bread was scarce and did not know how they were going to feed everyone. How did Jesus take this situation to focus everyone's attention on eternity and off of our daily needs.
