Sabbath Thought – Pentecost – By: Dan Dowd

On this coming Sunday, we will be observing the Feast of Pentecost once again. All of God's Holy Days as recorded in Leviticus 23 are important, but each also reveals a unique aspect of God's Plan of Salvation. Pentecost is no different in this regard. Pentecost represents the giving of God's Holy Spirit, a down-payment if you will of God's very nature and the bridge for Christ to be able to dwell in us (Romans 8:9, 11). For a refresher on the Feast of Pentecost I recommend reading our booklet, God's Holy Day Plan (http://www.gnmagazine.org/booklets/HD/).

After Christ rose from the dead, one of the things He told His disciples was to wait in Jerusalem for "...*the Promise of the Father, 'which' He said, 'you have heard from Me*," (Acts 1:4). I have often wondered what the disciples thought about this instruction. John chapter 14 records some of Christ's instruction regarding the Holy Spirit that was to come after His death, but did they comprehend what this would mean? I suspect not fully, because they didn't have any personal experience of what that meant – but nonetheless they waited.

In Acts 2:1-4 (MKJV) we read how that Promise was fulfilled, "And in the fulfilling of the day of *Pentecost, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly a sound came out of the heaven as borne along by the rushing of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And tongues as of fire appeared to them, being distributed; and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled of the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them utterance.*" How dramatic would that have been to witness? As baptized members of God's Church, we have that very same Spirit dwelling in us – a Spirit of power, love, a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7) and holiness (Romans 1:14) that is no less dramatic than that example 2,000 years ago.

With God's Spirit working in us, we are to take on the mind of Christ (Philippians 2:5) and become transformed (Romans 12:2). In doing so we become sons (and daughters) of God (Galatians 4:6, 1 John 3:2). Pentecost is a pivotal Holy Day. In it we rehearse ceasing to be driven only by our carnal nature hostile to God's way of life, but rather living according to the Spirit with true life and peace and with God dwelling in us (Romans 8:5-11).

Pentecost is a truly wonderful reminder of another step in God's Plan of Salvation revealed in His Holy Days. As we count down to that day let's remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ represented in the Passover that makes all of God's plan possible, and the sin we rehearsed coming out of in the Days of Unleavened Bread, so that we can once again be reminded of the very special gift God gives of His Holy Spirit to each and every one of His called-out ones.
