Video Studio Construction Contract

On Tuesday, January 9, I signed the contract for the construction of our new *Beyond Today* video recording studio. This was finalized yesterday with Millay & Company, who is our builder. Our studio fund has now exceeded \$800,000 and the plan is to start construction at the end of this month.

We pray for God's blessing on this facility to preach Jesus Christ's gospel of the Kingdom of God ever more effectively. I thank God every day for the tremendous staff and resources that we have been blessed with in the United Church of God to do just that.

ABC Career/Education Planning

This year at Ambassador Bible College, several classes have focused on career and education planning to support students as they explore their opportunities and develop a plan to follow upon graduation. Two of these classes were taught this week by Andy Lee and Michelle Waterhouse.

Each module starts with discussing biblical principles that are foundational to pursuing education and career goals. During this session, Andy Lee focused on the parable of the talents found in Matthew 25:14-30, exploring how we are all supposed to be "using our talents to further God's purpose."

Michelle Waterhouse helped students unpack the results of a 16 Personalities assessment, highlighting how understanding your individual personality can influence your career choice and affect both professional and personal relationships.

Additional topics covered include: resumes and cover letters, interviewing skills, conducting a job search, and establishing networking and professional relationships. Lisa Fenchel and Andy Lee are coordinating this valuable vocational and career guidance for our students.

Visit to Chile and Argentina Next Week

Beverly and I will leave Wednesday on a two-week visit to Chile and Argentina. Peter and Terri Eddington will also be coming. We plan to speak in Santiago a week from this Sabbath. Also, we will conduct a leadership seminar and a mid-week Bible Study that will be webcast to our other congregations in South America.

We will then travel to neighboring Argentina where we will meet with a Sabbath-keeping group with whom we have established a friendship and to whom we are offering support. On March 1, 2017, Dr. Don Ward, on behalf of the Council of Elders, wrote the following to them:

"After a recent presentation by Mario Seiglie, the senior pastor of the Spanish regions, concerning your request to have a close working relationship with the United Church of God, *an International Association* (UCGIA), the Council of Elders and the administration of UCGIA wish to convey our strong support for your request to serve your congregations in administrative and pastoral areas.

"Your story and spiritual journey to follow God's Word in faithful obedience is truly inspiring and reminds us that our Heavenly Father calls those whom He will call, where He will call them, and when He will call them to follow Jesus Christ (John 6:44). It gives us cause to rejoice when we consider how great and loving our God truly is. It is one thing to take a

stand, but it is clearly inspiring to see people remain standing for God's ageless truths--including keeping the Sabbath and all of God's Feast days.

"In honor of your request, we will be sending pastors and ministers, including Jaime Gallardo and Jaime Diaz, to serve your spiritual needs. Please receive them in the spirit of brotherly love and respect. We have the utmost confidence in their stewardship as dedicated ministers of Jesus Christ and as bridge-builders between peoples who share common beliefs."
